



## **Provincetown cited by national historic trust**

PROVINCETOWN - The National Trust for Historic Preservation has chosen Provincetown as one of its 2010 Dozen Distinctive Destinations for its unique cultural and recreational offerings.

It is the only town in Massachusetts to be chosen by the Trust - and one of three towns chosen in New England this year.

At town hall at 10 a.m. today, Provincetown Town Manager Sharon Lynn and Provincetown Historical Commission chairman Eric Dray are expected accept a plaque from Trust Regional Representative Rebecca Williams. The town was nominated for the honor by members of the historical commission.

For the last 10 years the trust has annually selected communities across the U.S. for the honor. The only other town chosen from Cape Cod and the Islands was Chatham in 2007, according to trust records.

Provincetown won the honor because of its beautiful coastal setting, colonial past and artistic flair, said trust president Richard Moe in a prepared statement.
