**Pilgrim Monument Anniversary Congratulations
and Memorabilia to be displayed**

The Pilgrim Monument and Provincetown Museum (PMPM) has mounted a new display of letters and items received throughout the celebration of the Centennial Anniversary of the Pilgrim Monument. These include a resolution signed by every member of the Massachusetts House of Representative, a congratulatory letter from Representative Bill Delahunt, and a proclamation from the Provincetown Board of Selectmen declaring August 5, 2010 “Provincetown Pilgrim Monument Re-dedication Day.” One of the most interesting items is a letter received recently from President Barack Obama, with his distinctive signature, sending greetings to all those celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Pilgrim Monument.

The display will also include the flag that was flown, at the request of Senator John Kerry, over the United States capital on August 5, 2010 in commemoration of the 100th Anniversary.

The **Pilgrim Monument and Provincetown Museum** is open 7 days a week from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. from April 1 through November with extended hours from June 1 to September 15 from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Admission Adults \$7.00; Seniors (age 62+) and Students (15+ with ID) \$5.00; Children (4 – 14) \$3.50; Children 3 and under are admitted free.

The **Pilgrim Monument** commemorates the Pilgrims’ first landing in America. Visitors can easily walk to the top using a unique series of steps and ramps around the interior of the building. The views from the top are breathtaking, and on clear days you can see both Plymouth and Boston. The **Provincetown Museum** features the history of Provincetown and the Outer Cape. Here you will see exhibits on the Pilgrims and the Mayflower, Provincetown’s

theater history including Eugene O'Neill and the Provincetown Players, artifact collections brought here from distant lands by sea captains, and much more.
